

Family Nurse Practitioner

POSITION OBJECTIVE/SUMMARY:

Under the direct supervision of the Chief Medical Officer, the Family Nurse Practitioner is responsible for completing physical examinations, diagnosis, and treatment of both chronic and episodic disorders to assigned clients; plans, implements, reviews, and confirms health care goals for assigned clients; remains responsible for the client(s) throughout the course of the treatment; determines when the client has recovered, and recommends release of the client. May refer the client to physicians for consultation or to specialized health resources for treatment but retains responsibility for clinical management as well as any subsequent modification.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED FOR THIS POSITION:

- Graduate from an accredited School of Nursing.
- A current license to practice as a Registered Nurse and a certificate to practice as a Nurse Practitioner issued by the California Board of Registered Nursing.
- Prescriptive Privileges and active and current DEA
- A current CPR Certification required.
- At least one year's experience working in family medicine.
- Baccalaureate or Master's Degree in Nursing with emphasis in Family Nurse Program can be substituted for one or two years experience, respectively.
- National Board certification from any recognized Credentialing Center pending or currently in process.
- Experience and ability to work with multi-cultured, multiethnic populations.
- Visual/hearing ability sufficient to comprehend written/verbal communications.
- Ability to perform tasks involving physical activity which may include lifting, bending and standing.
- The ability work additional hours, days and/or on special projects as needed.
- Ability to effectively deal with stress
